


Equivalence Course Structure - II

Applicable to students of B.Planning, admitted after AY 2011-12 and prior to AY 2015-16, who are following the earlier (2011) syllabus of SPA Vijayawada and who, due to non-fulfilment of academic requirements or detainment (year-repeat), are required to attend classes with batches admitted on or after AY 2015-16 from the time the new Course Structure of B.Planning of SPA Vijayawada is effective.

1. Preamble: Salient Features of 'Equivalence Course Structure II'

1.1 This is to be applicable only to – students of B.Planning of SPA Vijayawada, admitted after AY 2011-12 and prior to AY 2015-16, who are following the earlier syllabus of SPA Vijayawada and who, due to non-fulfilment of academic requirements or detainment (year-repeat), are required to attend classes with batches admitted on or after AY 2015-16 from the time the new Course Structure of B.Planning of SPA Vijayawada is effective.

The equivalency of subjects between old and new course structures is in terms of overall content of topics/units to be covered and academic requirements. Therefore, may not be interpreted as exact (word by word) equivalency.

1.2 The 'Equivalence Course Structure - II' is aimed to keep the old course structure and academic regulations unchanged for such students (as pt. 1.1) as per his/her year of admissions till he passes out, in spite of he/she being required to sit with batches where new course structure has been initiated. Hence, this equivalence regulation is to be read together with the course structure and academic regulations/exam rules, applicable to the students as per his/her year of admissions for its complete applicability.

1.3 The credits, nature of end evaluation, internal and end assessment, and attendance of such students (as pt. 1.1) for each subject undertaken shall be as per earlier course structure terminologies and syllabus following minimum academic requirements as per earlier academic regulations for which they were admitted.

1.4 Concerned subject teacher would require to develop exclusive question papers for evaluation of such students.

1.5 Results and score/mark sheets are to be issued to such students (as pt.1.1) as per format of the earlier course structure for which they were admitted and regulations as applicable to the student as per his/her year of admissions, on completion of all courses for a particular academic year.

1.6 The promotion of such students (as pt.1.1) from one academic year to the next shall be subject to passing of both the semesters in a particular academic year, as per regulations applicable to the student as per his/her year of admission. If the student fails to pass any semester, he/she shall be repeating concerned semester over the next academic year as per this 'Equivalence Course Structure II'. The results and score/mark sheets for such students shall be declared at the end of each academic year.

1.7 Each subject to be completed by such students (as pt.1.1) as per earlier course structure is considered 'equivalent to a particular subject of the new course structure' as presented in following Table 1.

Note:

- 1) The table starts from Sem II because there cannot be a case, where a student admitted before AY 2015-16, can repeat Sem I of the earlier syllabus as on Oct 2015 onwards.
- 2) Wherever Extra Classes are to be held as per Table below, are to be conducted as per the old course structure & syllabus.

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
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
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1.8 Through proper planning of Time-Tables, the Academic Year Coordinators and Department to ensure that while such students (as pt 1.1) shall be required to take some of their courses in classrooms which are different than their registered semester classroom (as per 2.4 above), in the process, he/she should not be missing any class/course pertaining to his old course structure, which is offered in his own registered semester classroom. The subject teacher of equivalent courses shall ensure through extra efforts that the assessments match the requirements of the old course structure.




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
